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Result of Palestinian Public Opinion Polls No. 10 January 1-2, 2005

Background:

Within an international and local attention paid to Palestinian presidential elections, the candidates launched their campaigns which are basically focusing on the adherence to Palestinian basic demands which are summed up as: an independent Palestinian state with Jerusalem as its capital, the right to remove all settlements and the right of return. These demands are added to fighting corruption, reinforcing the rule of law, putting an end to chaos and insecurity on the Palestinian scene.

Along with these realities, there comes the boycott of Hamas and the Islamic Jihad to the presidential elections both as candidates and as voters. The Public Front however decided not offer a candidate and it declared its support for the independent candidate Mustafa al-Barghouti. As for Fateh, the People's Party and the Democratic Front, each one of them nominated a candidate for presidency. This is in addition to the fact that there are four independent candidates making the total numbers of candidates competing to occupy the position of the head of the Palestinian Authority seven.

The first round of Palestinian local councils' election is over; elections were conducted in 26 locations on the 23rd of December, 04. In these elections, Fateh and Hamas won the majority of all seats.

It seems, however, that the presidential elections, regardless of who will win, will not lead to a breakthrough in the negotiation arena with the Israelis. Israel has already rejected the idea of a conference following Palestinian presidential elections in London to reactivate the Peace Process, which the British Prime Minster called for. Meanwhile, Israel is still involved in assassinations, the demolishing of houses, incursions in Palestinian cities, villages and refugee camps, heedless of local and international calls for a truce.

The Results:

Following are the results of the Tenth Palestinian Public Opinion Poll conducted by the Center for Opinion Polls and Survey Studies at An-Najah National University during the period January $1^{st} - 2^{nd}$. The University sponsors all polls conducted by its center. The Tenth Poll undertakes several subjects related basically to the Palestinian presidential elections, people's priorities following elections, the elections programs of candidates, the public opinion concerning the peace process and the Road Map, in addition to political sympathies and other issues.

The sample included 1356 persons whose age group is 18 years and above and who have the right to vote. The sample forms one per thousand from among the total number of Palestinian people of this age group. The enclosed questionnaire was distributed on 856 persons from the West Bank and 500 persons from the Gaza Strip. The sample was drawn randomly and the margin of error is about $\pm 3\%$. Still 1.5% of the members of the sample refused to answer the questionnaire.

Major Results:

- 74.3 % from among respondents assert that they will participate in the coming presidential elections.
- 72.2% believe that the elections will be fair and honest, while 20.7% see the contrary.
- 66.6 % from among respondents believe in the impartiality of local supervisors on elections and 60.0% believe in the impartiality of international supervisors.
- 61.4% from among respondents see that there is a need for the presence of international supervisors on presidential elections.
- 56.0 % from among respondents have not heard of elections programs for Bassam al-Salhi, 51.7% for Taysir Khalid, 72.6% for Sayyed Baraka, 61.1% for Abdul Haleem al-Ashqar, 72.6 % for Abdul-Karim Shbair, 12.2% for Mahmoud Abbas and 13.6% for Mustafa al-Barghothi.
- 2.7% from among respondents who will participate in the elections and who decided to choose the future president say they will give their vote to Bassam al-Salhi, 3.5% to Taysir Khalid, 1.8% to Sayyed Baraka, 3.1% to Abdul Haleem al-Ashqar, 1.4% to Abdul-Karim Shbair, 59.0% to Mahmoud Abbas and 28.5% to Mustafa al-Bargohthi.
- 17.5% say that they took the decision to vote on the basis of decisions made by their political party, 25.4% say they took it on the basis of the candidate's program and 4.6% on the basis of a commitment to the clan or the extended family.
- 68.9% believe that the coming president will make reforms within the Authority's institutions.
- 36.7% from among respondents believe that the elected president will turn the cases of corruption to the courts and law.
- 76.0% believe that the coming president will adhere to the principle that Jerusalem is the capital of the Palestinian state, 69.5% believe that he will adhere



to the right of return and 61.9% believe that he will insist on the removal of all settlements from the 1967 territories.

- 69.0% from among respondents believe that the coming president will be capable of fighting corruption, 75.1% believe that he will be capable of uniting all security apparatuses, 71.5% believe that he will be capable of enforcing law, 54.8% believe that he will be capable of putting an end to the chaotic use of arms, and 40.9% believe that he will be capable of protecting the subjects of Palestinian resistance.
- 84.9% from among respondents believe that the candidate who is most favored with international support is Mahmoud Abbas followed by Mustafa al-Barghuthi who received 6.6%.
- 11.6% from among respondents believe that the elected president will keep the same old staff members who worked for late president Arafat and 25.9% believe that he will change them.
- 37.9% from among respondents say that if they were elected for presidency, the first step they perform would be fighting corruption in public institutions, followed by imposing the rule of law, which received 28.9%.
- 32.8% from among respondents say that the first thing that they hope the new president will perform immediately after his election is fighting corruption.
- 81.1% support the appointment of a vice president by the new president.
- 60.1% from among respondents support replacing the present negotiating team with a new one.
- In case a settlement is reached between Palestinian and Israelis 95.5% of respondents reject compromising the right of East Jerusalem as the capital of the Palestinian State, 92.4% reject compromising the right of return and 90.3% reject compromising the creation of a Palestinian State in the 1967 borders.
- 85.3% do not trust Israeli Government's promises to facilitate the Palestinian elections.
- 69.0% support a ceasefire (*Hudna*) with Israel and 27.9% reject it.
- If a new ceasefire is enacted 58.8% from among respondents reject launching rockets at Israeli settlements in the Gaza Strip.
- 61.9% from among respondents support military operations against Israeli targets inside the West Bank and the Gaza Strip only.
- 57.4% support the peace process and 38.1% reject it.
- 73.9% believe that the Road Map is not viable any more.
- 75.3% from among respondents believe that restoring respect to the Palestinian Liberation Organization (PLO) is an essential issue.
- 73.9% from among respondents do not feel that they themselves, their families or properties are secure under the current circumstances.
- 24.3% are pessimistic about the general future of the Palestinian people in the coming few years.
- 84.1% from among respondents see a need for the existence of a program that would define the forms of Palestinian resistance.



- 83.3% reject strikes and the suspension of activities at educational institutions as forms of resistance against occupation.
- 33.3% support the call for the demilitarization of the *Intifada*, while 60.0% reject it.
- 90.9% believe that the American president is not faithful in his declaration concerning the Palestinian state.
- 5.5% believe that the American administration will force Israel to a complete withdrawal to the 1967 borders, while 70.3% say that only Israel will decide the size of its withdrawal.
- 42.1% from among respondents evaluate European support to the Palestinian Authority as "good" and 23.8% evaluate Arab support as "good".
