## **Majd Kokaly-Information Department:**

A poll recently conducted by the **PCPO** and prepared by **Dr.Nabil Kukali** included a random sample of 619 adults, 18 years and older, from the West Bank including East Jerusalem.

President of the PCPO, **Dr. Nabil Kukali**, stated that the poll took place on March 14-20,2003 and the average age of the respondents was 30.55 years, and the margin of error was 3.9± percent points.

**Kukali** also stated that the percentage of female respondents was 43.5%, while that of the male ones was 56.5%. He also explained that the respondent's location of residence was as follows: 49.4% city, 37.6% village, and 13.0% refugee camp. He

pointed out to the average size of respondents' families that was 6.22 persons, and the average number of schooling years was 11.99 years.

**Dr. Kukali** believed that according to the results of this poll, Arafat's popularity has increased from 44% in January 2003 to 53.3% nowadays. It seems, he added, that appointing a Prime Minister was regarded by the Palestinian people a serious step, which was taken by their President to implement reformation inside the Palestinian National Authority Structure and Organizations.

Such a step has led to an increase in the President's popularity.
