A poll carried out by the Palestinian Center for Public Opinion (PCPO) and prepared by President Dr. Nabil Kukali.

- * 69.8% Evaluate the general economical conditions in the Palestinian territories as bad.
- * 49.8% Worried to varying degrees for their means of Subsistence.
- * 56.0% Pessimistic about the future.
- * 64.7% Believe that the PA is incapable of creating job opportunities for the Palestinians workers in Israel.

Majd Kokaly-Information Department:

A poll recently conducted by the PCPO and prepared by Dr. Nabil Kukali included a random sample of 728 adults, 18 years and older, from the West Bank including East Jerusalem. The Poll reveals that 69.8% of Palestinians evaluate the general economical condition in the Palestinian Territories as bad, while 23.1% evaluate it fair, 2.6% good, and 4.5% express no opinion.

President of the PCPO, Dr. Nabil Kukali, stated that the poll took place April 2-7,2003 and the average age of the respondents was 30.68 years, and the margin of error was ±3.6 percent points. Kukali also stated that the percentage of female respondents was 47.8%, while that of the male ones was 52.2%. He also explained that the respondent's location of residence was as follows: 48.3% city, 41.0% village, and 10.7% refugee camp. He pointed out to the average size of respondents' families that was 6.3 persons, and the average number of schooling years was 11.9 years.
