The Ministry of Public Works and Housing budget was


ILS 129,351,586, or 0.73% of overall expenditures from the 2023 public budget.


Distribution of 2023 Ministry of Public Works and Housing budget according to item/ILS





1	Road rehabilitation, especially within governorates and between villages and towns	53,788,073
2	General repairs to roads in the West Bank	19,111,927
3	Road design projects/housing plans/GIS systems	3,010,000

 Road rehabilitation projects are distributed over approximately 40 projects in the various governorates.

Gender-responsive budget indicators:

- Rehabilitation of several houses in the West Bank for poor and marginalized sectors at an estimated budget of ILS1.3 million.
- Rehabilitation of black spots on road networks, which are "places on roads where accidents often happen", at an estimated budget of ILS2.5 million.

Number of employees at the Ministry of Public Works and Housing is 383 male and female employees.

Ministry of Public Works and Housing directorates are distributed in all Palestinian governorates.

Important terms:

Citizen Budget:

a simplified document of the public budget of the Ministry of Public Works and Housing. It summaries the policies, approaches and priorities of the Ministry for the coming years expressed in numbers in the approved budget and which enables citizens to become familiarized with the distribution of operational and developmental expenses at the Ministry and on the various programs and consequently, to monitor governmental expenditures on the Ministry of Public Works and Housing.

Operational costs:

the necessary expenditures for the operation of the public institution, i.e. the Ministry (Electricity, water, fuel, travel, etc.)

Developmental expenditures:

are expenditures which have a nature that is different from current expenditures in terms of their useful life and the return from expenditures, and are financed by the PA budget and donors.

Capital expenditures:

what the government [Ministry] spends on the possession of capital assets (buildings, land, equipment, vehicles, etc.)

Current expenditures:

This includes salaries and wages, raises, operational and referral expenditures of the ministry, public institutions and the other executive bodies of the State of Palestine.

Program for employees not distributed among programs:

A program especially for employees in the Gaza Strip.

Gender-responsive budget:

A gender-responsive budget is considered a tool for financial planning with economic and social dimensions, which helps the government to integrate gender in the preparation and implementation of the public budget. This is to ensure that available financial resources are allocated in a just manner and aimed at eradicating discrimination on the basis of gender in regards to government services and in a way that meets the specific needs of men, women, girls, boys and marginalized social sectors.

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
