Vision:

A vigorous, regulated, and motivating labor sector that actively contributes to sustainable development.

Mission:

As a leader of the Palestinian labor sector, the Ministry of Labor (MOL) regulates the labor market, provides distinctive services to production parties, and qualifies and employs the labor force from both sexes, as well as providing social protection to them. This is done under decent work conditions and requirements to enhance economic, social, and environmental development with a great level of professionalism and transparency, in accordance with the applicable labor legislations and inconformity with international standards and practices within the tripartite partnership framework.

Strategic Objectives of the Labor Sector in 2021-2023:

- 1. Develop employment opportunities and services.
- 2. Qualify and prepare a well-trained professional workforce, in line with labor market needs.
- 3. Enhance the application of appropriate work principles in Palestine.
- 4. Strengthen and institutionalize the social protection of workers.
- 5. Build the capacities of tripartite partnership institutions.




The budget of the Ministry of Labor in 2023 was ILS82,259,537, or approximately 0.47% of the total general expenditures



Labor Cooperation Commission

Mission: Working to promote the role of the cooperative sector to elevate economic and social development and to expand the platform of active and effective unions and cooperatives both quantitatively and qualitatively. This is through diligently encouraging, organizing, and developing cooperative work and preserving the application of principles and values of global cooperation and prompting the exercise of food governance in institutions in the cooperatives sector.

Strategic objectives:

- ·First strategic objective: an institutional and legislative environment to enable cooperative movement to continue and develop.
- ·Second strategic objective: improvement of the financial and organizational performance of cooperatives
- ·Third strategic objective: cooperative work that includes new sectors and fields of work.

The budget of the 2023 Cooperative Work Agency Budget was ILS 4,39,854 while the budget for projects was ILS1,229,844. The two-pronged budget (programs and projects) is distributed as follows:



Distribution of budget for the Cooperative





Number of working cooperatives distributed over the main economic sectors in the northern districts.



Overall approvals for grants issued by the Labour Cooperation Commission for cooperatives was estimated at JD1 million, from which 36 cooperatives benefited.

Palestinian Employment Fund

The Palestinian Employment Fund was established to support economic development through reviving and incentivising Labormarket policies, aimed at creating and generating permanent job opportunities and developing social capital to combat poverty and unemployment on a strategic basis. The Fund was established in 2003 upon Presidential Decree No. 9, which was later transformed into a national umbrella for programs and projects for creating job opportunities, especially for male and female graduates, based on a cabinet decision in 2014.

Vision: A Palestinian society free of unemployment, which all members participate in the Labor market through suitable job opportunities that contribute to the alleviation of poverty and achieve higher national goals that promote dignity and Palestinian rights.

Mission: The Fund shall be the national umbrella for employment and job creation, and it shall be deemed the executive arm of the national employment policies and the Ministry of Labor policies in the field of employment.

The Fund shall seek to provide sustainable job opportunities for youth graduates, women, marginalized groups, persons with disabilities, and unemployed persons.

Terminology and Definitions:

- Citizen's Budget: is a simplified document of the Ministry of Labor's General Budget in a way that summarizes the Ministry's policies ,orientations, and priorities for the coming year. This is expressed by the figures mentioned in the approved budget. The Citizen's Budget enables citizens to learn about the MOL's distribution of operational and developmental expenditures and the Ministry's different programmes, thus enabling citizens to follow up government spending in the labor sector.
- Operational Expenditures: are the needed expenditures to operate the Ministry, such as electricity fees, water, fuel, travel and missions, etc. These expenditures are part of the current expenditures.
- Developmental Expenditures: are expenditures that have a different nature from current expenditures in terms of lifespan and return on expenditures. These expenditures are financed by the Palestinian Authority budget and also by donors.
- Capital Expenditures: are the expenses paid by the government (Ministry) for acquiring fixed assets and inventory (buildings, lands, equipment, vehicles, etc.).
 - Service Procurement: is the purchase by an official institution (Ministry) of a certain service (insurance, cleaning service, maintenance, etc.) from a private entity in return for a sum of money, whereas the private entity provides the needed service in accordance with the agreed-upon terms.
- Current Expenditures: include salaries, wages, allowances, and the operational and transfer expenditures of ministries, public institutions, and executive bodies/agencies of the Palestinian state.
- Gender-responsive Budget: is a financial planning tool with economic and social dimensions. It helps the government integrate the gender perspective when preparing and executing the General Budget to ensure that the available financial resources are allocated in an equitable and targeted manner to eliminate gender-based discrimination during the provision of public services. This should meet the specific needs of women and men, as well as those of marginalized groups inside the society.
- Employees not distributed among programs: is a special program for employees in the northern governorates "Gaza Strip".
