


The Ministry of Health budget for 2023 was ILS2,542,648,819, or 14.4% of total expenditures of the 2032 General Budget, distributed as follows:



Service Procurement:

There were approximately 110,000 transfers for the procurement of health services from facilities not belonging to the MOH, with an estimated budget ceiling of 500 million Shekels.

·It should be noted that the Ministry of Labour provides medical transfers to citizens in the northern and southern districts. However, Israel obstructs medical transfers for residents of the Gaza Strip. According to the WHO report, Israel prevented over one-third of patients (35%) and over half of their accompaniments, [54%], from obtaining the necessary permits to cross and receive their right to health care. 30% of permits for sick children were approved without approval for one their parents as an accompaniment.

Purchase of vaccines: An amount of ILS30 million was allocated for the provision of vaccines from the 2023 General Budget



Percentage of medical service recipients according to gender



Number of Ministry of Health employees (19,827)




Distribution of government hospitals

Important Terms:

- Operational Expenditures: are the needed expenditures to operate the Ministry of Health and its facilities (such as building-related fees, electricity fees, water, fuel, medical consumables, etc.). This also includes medical transfers and medicines.
- ·Capital Expenditures: include the expenses paid for acquiring capital assets (e.g., buildings, lands, equipment, vehicles, etc.), as well as capital transfers related to projects. This item also includes expenses for capital development
- Developmental Expenditures: are expenditures that have a different nature from current expenditures in terms of life span and return on expenditures. This also includes the expenses for developing the quality of health services in Palestine.
- Social Contributions: is the government contribution in the General Commission for Insurance and Pensions.
- Days of Medication: are the total days spent at hospital (i.e., overnight stays) for hospitalization purposes.

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
