2025 Ministry of Health Budget


The Ministry of Health budget for 2025 was **ILS2,893,071,232**, or **15.6%** of total expenditure of the 2025 budget



- In 2025 the public budget was ratified as an emergency budget, whereby spending is based on the monthly cash flows from the Ministry of Finance
- Operational expenditures at the Ministry of Health include the costs of medical referrals, procurement of medicines and the operational costs of Ministry of Health facilities including hospitals, health centers and directorates

Distribution of Ministry of Health budget according to item/ILS




Distribution ratios of the Ministry of Health budget according to item

Service Procurement:

Transfers to purchase health services from outside the Ministry's facilities were estimated at approximately **96,548** transfers with an estimated budget of **ILS750 million**.


Government hospitals and health clinics

Note: Due to the Israeli aggression on the Gaza Strip and the systematic destruction of the health system and infrastructure, the number of functioning hospitals in the Gaza Strip dropped from 13 to 7, all of which are only partially functional. Moreover, the number of government and nongovernment hospitals dropped from 36 to 19 hospitals, all of which are only partially functional. Furthermore, the total number of active primary healthcare centers was 78, most of which were only partially functioning: 19 governmental, 11 UNRWA-run and the remaining centers run by active civil society organizations, in addition to some international and foreign institutions operating in the Gaza Strip.


Distribution of government hospitals in Palestinian governorates


Distribution of government hospitals in Palestinian governorates

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Distribution of government hospitals in Palestinian governorates












Distribution of primary health care centers in governorates

Important Terms:

- Citizen Budget: A simplified publication of the Ministry of Health budget, which summarizes government ministries' policies and approaches for the coming year, expressed in numbers in this budget. It familiarizes citizens with how expenditures and revenues are distributed and allows them to track public spending. The average citizen can easily understand it because it is based on simple and organized data and uses charts, graphs and pictures.
- **Operational Expenditures:** are the needed expenditures to operate the Ministry of Health and its facilities (such as building-related fees, electricity fees, water, fuel, medical consumables, etc.). This also includes medical transfers and medicines.
- **Developmental Expenditures:** are expenditures that have a different nature from current expenditures in terms of life span and return on expenditures. This also includes the expenses for developing the quality of health services in Palestine.
- Capital Expenditures: include the expenses paid for acquiring capital assets (e.g., buildings, lands, equipment, vehicles, etc.), as well as capital transfers related to projects. This item also includes expenses for capital development
- Current expenditures: include salaries, wages, allowances, and the operational and transfer expenditures of ministries, public institutions, and executive bodies/agencies of the Palestinian state.
- Gender-responsive budget: A gender-responsive budget is considered a tool for financial planning with economic and social dimensions, which helps the government to integrate gender in the preparation and implementation of the public budget. This is to ensure that available financial resources are allocated in a just manner and aimed at eradicating discrimination on the basis of gender in regards to government services and in a way that meets the specific needs of men, women, girls, boys and marginalized social sectors.
- Days of Medication: are the total days spent at hospital (i.e., overnight stays) for hospitalization purposes.

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
